## **Purpose of License Conditions**

- To ensure clarity as to what items, end-uses, and end-users are authorized under an export license
- Conditions may address ambiguities or specific concerns about any of the above.
- Conditions place boundaries around the license and what it authorizes.



**Standard License Conditions** 

- 'Boilerplate language' replaces previous standard conditions on end-use, resale/reexport/transfer and requiring that consignees be informed.
- Some standard conditions remain for certain licenses.
- Conditions may also be applied case-by-case.


### When License Conditions Attack


- What is it?
  - Non-specific technical descriptions (e.g., copying the ECCN)
- Who will receive it?
  - Undefined or unclear roles of consignees and endusers
- For what can they use it?
  - Broad end-use statements
  - Item's utility in end-use not immediately clear
