Dear Mr. Chairman:

I hereby report to the Congress the export licensing actions taken by the Department of Commerce's Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) relating to exports and reexports of agricultural commodities to Cuba from April 1 through June 30, 2017, as required by Section 906(b) of the Trade Sanctions Reform and Export Enhancement Act of 2000 (TSRA) (Title IX of Pub. L. 106-387), as amended.

During the reporting period, BIS processed 18 notifications under License Exception Agricultural Commodities (AGR) for exports to Cuba. BIS approved 14 notifications, on average within 10 days. BIS returned 4 notifications without action, on average within two days, due to errors and deficiencies. BIS approved 6 standard export license applications for the export of AGR-eligible commodities, on average within 30 days. The applicants chose to submit license applications after being advised of the products eligibility for License Exception AGR. BIS also returned without action 6 standard export license applications for the export of AGR-eligible commodities, on average within 3 days, for resubmission as AGR notifications. Notifications and applications for the export of AGR-eligible commodities that are returned without action are routinely re-submitted and generally approved.
