Export Control Reform

The U.S. Exports for 600-Series and 9x515 Items Under BIS Jurisdiction

October 15, 2013 to December 31, 2016

Since the 1st ECR Transition Rule became effective on October 15, 2013, military items in 15 categories of the United States Munitions List (USML) that do not warrant control on the USML have transitioned to the Commerce Control List (CCL) under President Obama's Export Control Reform Initiative. New Export Control Classification Numbers (ECCNs) known as 600-Series and 9x515 are created for these items.

The U.S. exports of 600-Series and 9x515 items from October 15, 2013 to December 31, 2016 totaled 269,037 shipments¹ for approximately \$17.8 billion.



Of \$16.5 billion in the U.S. exports of 600-series and 9x515 items under BIS jurisdiction, the top destinations were Japan with \$2.6 billion (15.7% of the total value), Canada with \$1.5 billion (8.8%) and French Guiana where The Guiana Space Center run by France and the EU located with \$1.3 billion (7.9%).



Of \$16.5 billion in the U.S. exports of 600-sereis and 9x515 items under BIS jurisdiction, licensed exports totaled \$9.6 billion (58.2% of the total); STA totaled \$2.1 billion (12.5%); and NLR to Canada and for 9A515.e items to all destinations totaled \$1.4 billion (8.6%).

TMP: Temporary imports, exports, reexports, and transfers (in-country)

LVS: Shipments of limited value

TSU: Technology and software-unrestricted
