



Of the \$26.1 billion in U.S. exports of 600-Series and 9x515 items from October 15, 2013 to December 31, 2017, \$24.4 billion (93.6% of the total) was shipped under BIS jurisdiction; and \$1.7 billion (6.4%) was shipped under DDTC jurisdiction<sup>2</sup>.

### U.S. Exports of 600-Series and 9x515 Items under BIS Authorization

Of the \$24.4 billion in U.S. exports under BIS jurisdiction from October 15, 2013 to December 31, 2017:

- > \$18.4 billion were for 600-series items; and
- ➤ \$6.0 billion were for 9x515 items.

Of the \$18.4 billion in U.S. exports under BIS jurisdiction for 600-sereis items, the top 15 destinations were Japan with \$3.2 billion (17.4% of the total value), Canada with \$2.0 billion (11.0%) and United Kingdom with \$1.9 billion (10.3%).

Of the \$6.0 billion in U.S. exports under BIS jurisdiction for 9x515 items, the top 15 destinations were French Guiana where the Guiana Space Center run by France and European Union is located with \$1.4 billion (23.8% of the total value), France with \$1.3 billion (22.2%) and Japan with \$571.4 million (9.5%).


