


I. Total U.S. Trade in goods with China

In 2018, U.S. exports to China totaled \$120.3 billion, a 7.4% (\$9.6 billion) decrease from 2017; U.S. imports from China totaled \$539.5 billion, a 6.7% (\$34.1 billion) increase; and the trade deficit was \$419.2 billion, an 11.6% (\$43.6 billion) increase.



In 2018, the level of U.S. imports from China exceeded the prior five-year average level by value not adjusted for inflation. The level of exports to China for 2018 was below the five-year average by value. In 2018, the U.S. trade balance with China was negative.

In 2018, of the \$120.3 billion in U.S. exports to China, the top commodity sectors were Transportation Equipment (23.0%); Machinery and Mechanical Appliances (22.5%), and Chemicals, Plastics, Leather Goods (16.4%).

In 2018, of the \$539.5 billion in U.S. imports from China, the top commodity sectors were Machinery and Mechanical Appliances (49.8%); Miscellaneous Manufactured Items (12.0%) and textiles and footwear (10.9%).



China maintains significant share of the U.S. – World Trade. In 2018, 7.2 % of total U.S. exports of \$1.7 trillion to the world were exported to China and 21.2% of total U.S. Imports of \$2.5 trillion were imported from China.

Exports


In 2018, the U.S. exported \$6.8 billion worth of Wood Products to China, representing 17.0% of the total U.S. exports to the World of those commodities; and the U.S exports of \$9.8 billion worth of Optical, Measuring, Medical or Other Instruments to China, represented 10.7% of the total U.S. exports to the World of those commodities. Additionally, the U.S. exported \$27.7 billion worth of Transportation Equipment, representing 10.0% of the total U.S. exports of those commodities.

<u>Imports</u>


In 2018, the U.S. imported \$64.9 billion worth of furniture, bedding, lamps, toys, games, sport equipment, paint and other miscellaneous manufactured items from China, representing 60.9% of the total U.S. imports of those commodities; and the U.S. imports of \$58.6 billion worth of Textiles and Footwear represented 39.8% of total U.S. imports of those commodities. Additionally, the U.S. imported \$268.5 billion worth of Machinery and Mechanical Appliances from China, representing 36.3% of the total U.S. imports of those commodities.



In 2018, the U.S. Advanced Technology Products (ATP)¹ exports to China were \$39.1 billion, a 9.8% increase (\$3.5 billion) from 2017; the U.S. ATP imports were \$173.8 billion, a 1.6% (\$2.7 billion) increase; and the ATP trade deficit was \$134.6 billion, a 0.6% decrease (\$840 million less).




In 2018, the largest categories of the U.S. ATP exports were Aerospace with \$18.3 billion, followed by Electronics with \$6.9 billion and Information & Communications with \$4.0 billion.



¹ Advanced Technology Products: About 500 of some 22,000-export commodity classification codes contain products from a recognized high technology category (e.g. Biotechnology).



In 2018, the largest categories of the U.S. ATP imports from China were Information & Communications with \$157.1 billion.






II. U.S. Exports to China subject to U.S. Government Filing Requirements

- In 2018, of the \$120.3 billion in U.S. exports to China:
 - o 3.0% were subject to a BIS license requirement
 - 0.4% were exported under a BIS license; Worldwide, 0.4% were exported under a BIS license.
 - 2.6% were exported under a BIS license exception; Worldwide, 1.2% were exported under a BIS license exception.
 - o 22.2% were exported under No License Required with an ECCN; Worldwide, 12.1% were exported under No License Required with an ECCN.







In 2018, U.S. exports to China shipped under a BIS license exception totaled \$3,104.3 million, a 26.7% (\$655.0 million) increase from 2018.




In 2018, the top license exception Encryption commodities, Software and Technology (ENC) totaled \$2.9 billion (93.1% of all license exceptions), followed by Civil End-Users totaled \$114.9 million (3.7%).








BIS License Determination Trends for China

III. BIS Licensing to China

In 2018, BIS reviewed 3,563 export/re-export applications (not including deemed export applications) valued at \$3.5 billion for China, out of a total of 33,844 applications worldwide valued at \$81.3 billion.

- Approved applications for China totaled 2,910 (81.7% of the total applications) for \$2.5 billion, compared to the 29,032 (85.8%) approved applications for all destinations that totaled \$64.3 billion.




In 2018, BIS reviewed 410 deemed export applications from Chinese nationals, 40.7% of 1,007 applications worldwide. Applications from Chinese nationals significantly reduced from 816 in 2017 and 820 in 2016, respectively.

- Approved applications for Chinese nationals totaled 350 (85.4% of the total applications), compared to 846 (91.5%) approved applications for all destinations.
