
The Fifth USML to CCL Regulatory Change Military Electronics

December 30, 2014 to March 31, 2019


Since the fifth USML to CCL regulatory change became effective on December 30, 2014, BIS has approved a total of 11,808 licenses. The average number of BIS license applications for the eight 600-Series items created by this rule is 262 per month through March 31, 2019. The approval rate is 88.5%.



From the effective date of December 30, 2014 to March 31, 2019, U.S. exports of items in the fifth USML to CCL regulatory change – Military Electronics items (3y611 and 9y620) under BIS jurisdiction totaled 49,025 shipments for \$3.3 billion.



Of the \$3.3 billion in U.S. exports of 600-series items in the fifth USML to CCL regulatory change under BIS jurisdiction from December 30, 2014 to March 31, 2019, licensed exports totaled \$1.3 billion (39.3% of the total); Strategic Trade Authorization (STA) totaled \$824.9 million (24.7%) and Servicing and replacement of parts and equipment (RPL) totaled \$362.7 million (10.9%).

BIS License Exceptions:

STA: Strategic Trade Authorization

RPL: Servicing and replacement of parts and equipment

GOV: Governments, international organizations, international inspections under the Chemical Weapons

Convention, and the International Space Station

NLR: No License Required

TMP: Temporary imports, exports, reexports, and transfers (in-country)
