

Update Conference 2022 Survey

The Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) is beginning preparations for the 2022 Update Conference and is interested in feedback from the exporting community on certain aspects of the Conference, with a special focus on the health and safety of Conference attendees. BIS organizes its seminars and conferences under the authority of the Mutual Educational and Cultural Exchange Act (MECEA) (22 U.S.C. § 2455). Under MECEA, BIS uses no-year funding (i.e., not appropriated funds) to cover the initial payment of the costs associated with the seminars and conferences, and is required to recover these costs via the registration fees charged for the events. Therefore, while BIS strives to keep its conference and seminar fees as low as possible, BIS expects that the fees will increase in line with cost increases in the hospitality and travel industries.
