

Summary

In 2021, both U.S. exports and imports increased despite of Covid-19 Pandemic. In 2021, U.S. exports totaled \$1.8 trillion, a 23.1% (\$329.0 billion) increase from \$1.4 trillion in 2020; U.S. imports totaled \$2.8 trillion, a 21.3% (\$496.9 billion) increase; and the trade deficit was \$1.1 trillion (rounded) at a record high, a 18.4% (\$167.9 billion) increase.

In 2021, of the \$1.8 trillion in U.S. exports, the top commodity sectors were Machinery and Mechanical Appliances (22.5%), followed by Chemicals, Plastics, Rubber, and Leather products (17.3%), the same as 2020. Oils, Minerals, Lime, and Cement (14.3%) replaced Transportation equipment as the 3rd top commodity sector.

In 2021, of the \$2.8 trillion in U.S. imports, the top commodity sectors were Machinery and Mechanical Appliances (29.1%), followed by Chemicals, Plastics, Rubber, and Leather products (14.7%), and Transportation Equipment (10.9%), the same as 2020.

In 2021, U.S. exported \$1.8 trillion in goods, of which \$39.0 billion (2.8% of the total exports) was exported under a government license, \$51.4 billion (2.9%) was exported under a government license exception/exemption/agreement, and \$176.6 billion (10.1%) was exported under No License Required with an ECCN reported, which includes 600-Series .y subparagraph items and 0A501 .y subparagraph firearms items (EAR99 excluded).

In 2021, BIS reviewed **40,843** license applications with a total value of **\$1.4 trillion**. Of these, **942** were Deemed Export applications and **39,901** were applications for the export and re-export of tangible items, software, and technology; an increase of 5.0% (1,885 more) from 38,016 in 2020.

In 2021, for tangible items, software and technology, approved licenses totaled 34,369, an increase of 4.8% (1,560 more) and the approval rate was 86.1%. Denied license applications totaled 826, an increase of 99.0% (411 more) and the denied rate was 2.1%; and return without action totaled 4,706, a decrease of 1.8% (86 less) and the RWA rate was 11.8%.

In 2021, BIS reviewed **942** applications for Deemed Export, a decrease of 22.3% from 1,212 in 2020, mainly due to the decrease in applications from Chinese and Iranian nationals. The approved licenses for Deemed Export from Chinese nationals decreased by 33.6% from 423 approvals in 2020 to 281 approvals in 2021; and approved licenses for Iranian nationals decreased by 24.8% from 242 in 2020 to 182 in 2021.

In 2021, the top approved ECCNs were 9A610 for Military aircraft and related commodities with 5,265 approvals (221 more than 2020), followed by 0A501 for Firearms with 5,258 approvals (7 less), and 2B350 for Chemical manufacturing facilities and equipment with 2,225 (106 more).

In 2021, the average processing time was 33 calendar days.

I. Total U.S. Trade with the World

In 2021, both U.S. exports and imports increased despite of Covid-19 Pandemic. In 2021, U.S. exports totaled \$1.8 trillion, a 23.1% (\$329.0 billion) increase from \$1.4 trillion in 2020; U.S. imports totaled \$2.8 trillion, a 21.3% (\$496.9 billion) increase; and the trade deficit was \$1.1 trillion (rounded) at a record high, a 18.4% (\$167.9 billion) increase.



In 2021, both U.S. export value and import value were above the average value of the proceeding five years not adjusted for inflation.

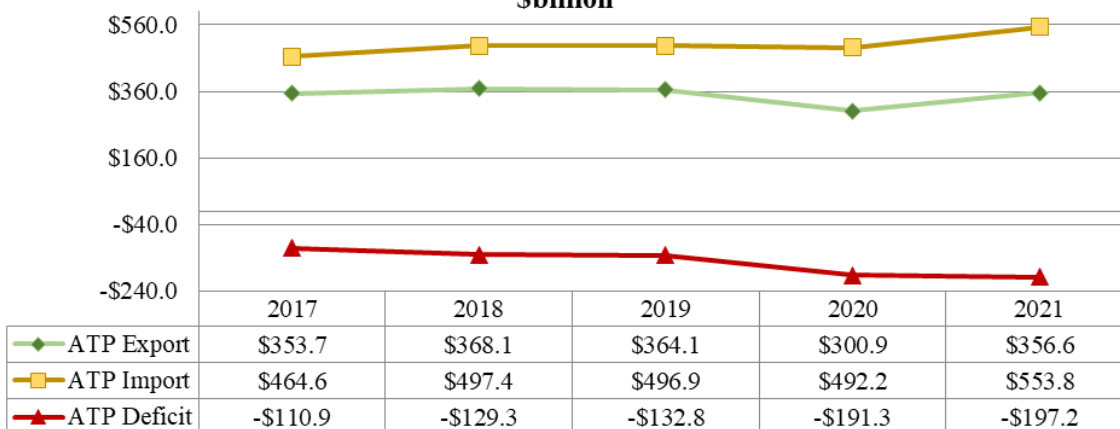

In 2021, the U.S. Advanced Technology Products (ATP)¹ exports were \$356.6 billion, an 18.5% (\$55.7 billion) increase from 2020; the U.S. ATP imports were \$553.8 billion, an 12.5% (\$61.6 billion) increase; and the ATP trade deficit was \$197.2 billion, a 3.1% (\$5.8 billion) increase.

II. Exports to the World subject to U.S. Government Export Control

In 2021, U.S. exported \$1.8 trillion in goods, of which \$48.9 billion (2.8% of the total exports) was exported under a government license:

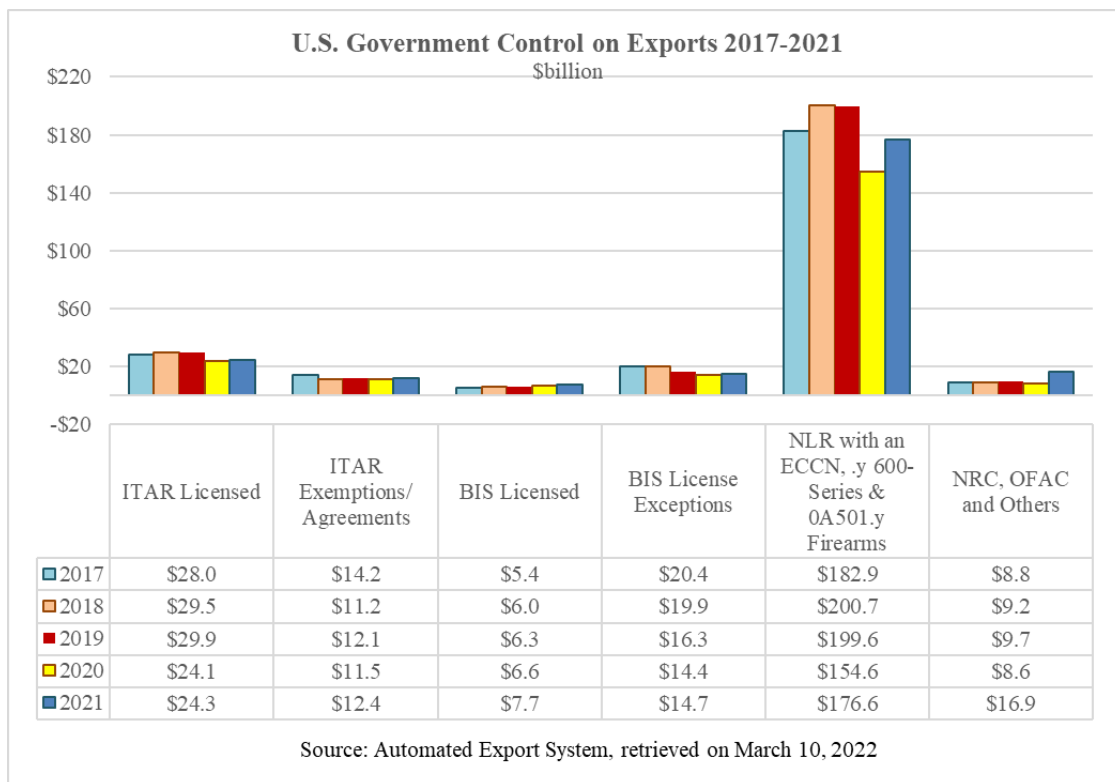
- \$7.7 billion was licensed by BIS, an increase of 17.6%, \$1.2 billion more compared to 2020.
- \$24.3 billion was licensed under ITAR, an increase of 0.8%, \$196.5 million more; and
- \$16.9 billion was licensed by NRC, OFAC and other government agencies, an increase of 97.3% , \$8.3 billion more.

In 2021, \$27.1 billion (1.5% of the total exports) was exported under a government license exception/exemption/agreement:

- \$14.7 billion was under BIS license exceptions, an increase of 2.4%, \$342.8 million more compared to 2020; and
- \$12.4 billion was under ITAR license exemption/agreements, an increase of 7.4%, \$851.3 million more.

In 2021, \$176.6 billion (10.1% of the total exports) was exported under No License Required (NLR):

- \$176.2 billion was under NLR with an ECCN reported (not including EAR99), an increase of 14.2%, \$22.0 billion more compared to 2020; and
- \$287.7 million was under NLR for 600-Series .y subparagraph items, an increase of 2.6%, \$7.3 million more.
- \$21.4 million was exported under NLR for 0A501 .y subparagraph firearms items, an increase of 112.1%, \$11.3 million more.



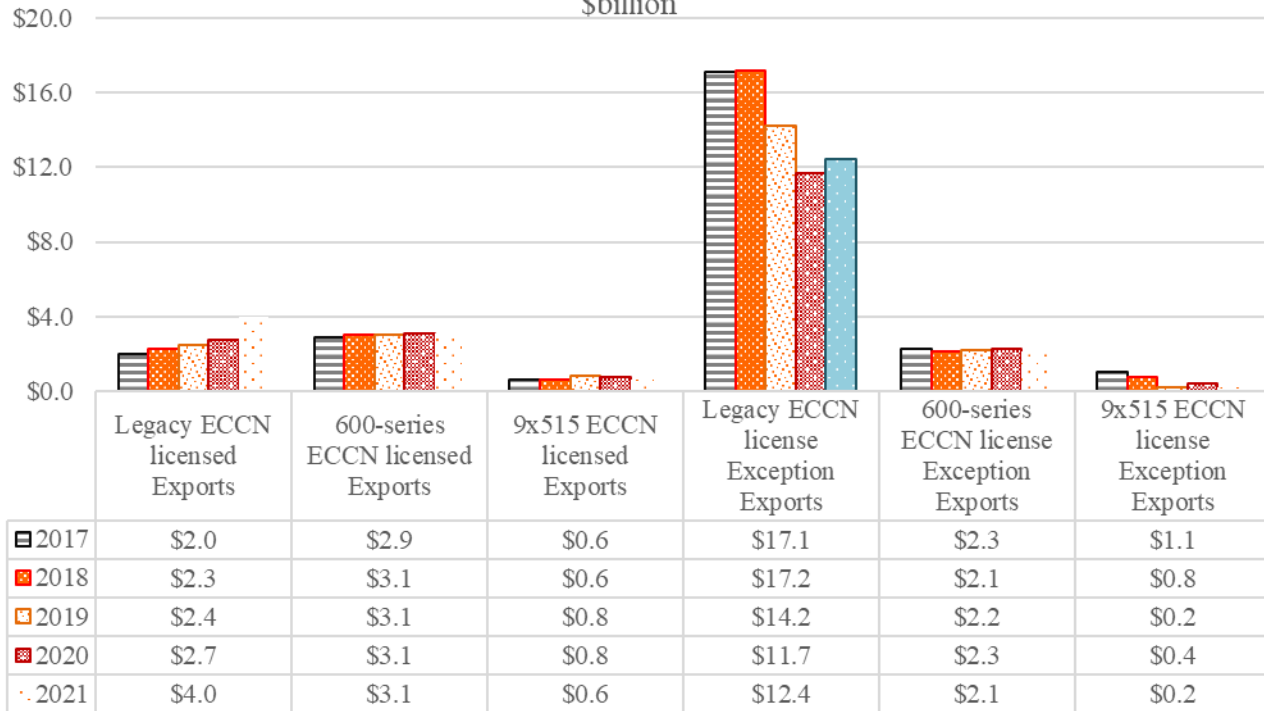


U.S. Exports to the World subject to U.S. Government Export Control

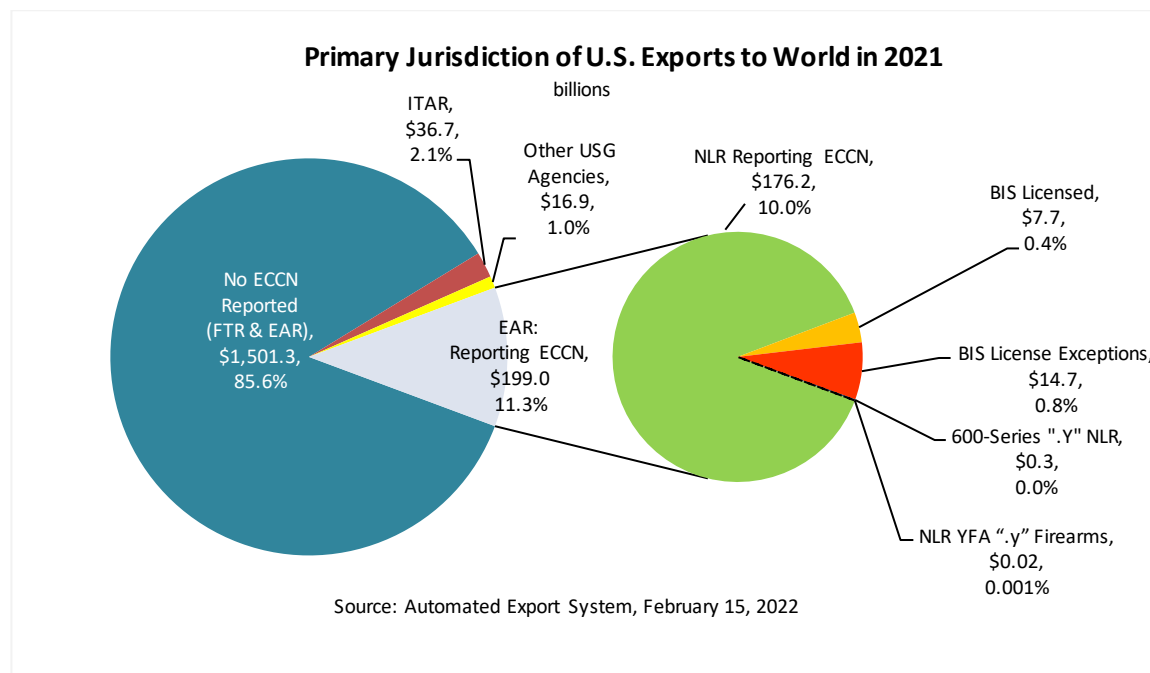

In 2021, of \$1.8 trillion in U.S. exports to the World:

- \$22.4 billion (1.3% of the total exports) were subject to a BIS license requirement:
 - 0.4% was exported under a BIS license.
 - 0.8% was exported under a BIS license exception.
- \$176.2 billion (10.1%) were exported under No License Required (NLR) with an ECCN reported and NLR for 600-series .y subparagraph items as well as NLR for 0A501 .y subparagraph firearms items.
 - 10.0% was exported under NLR with an ECCN reported.
 - 0.02% was exported under NLR for 600-series .y subparagraph items; and
 - 0.001% was exported under NLR for 0A501.y subparagraph firearms items.

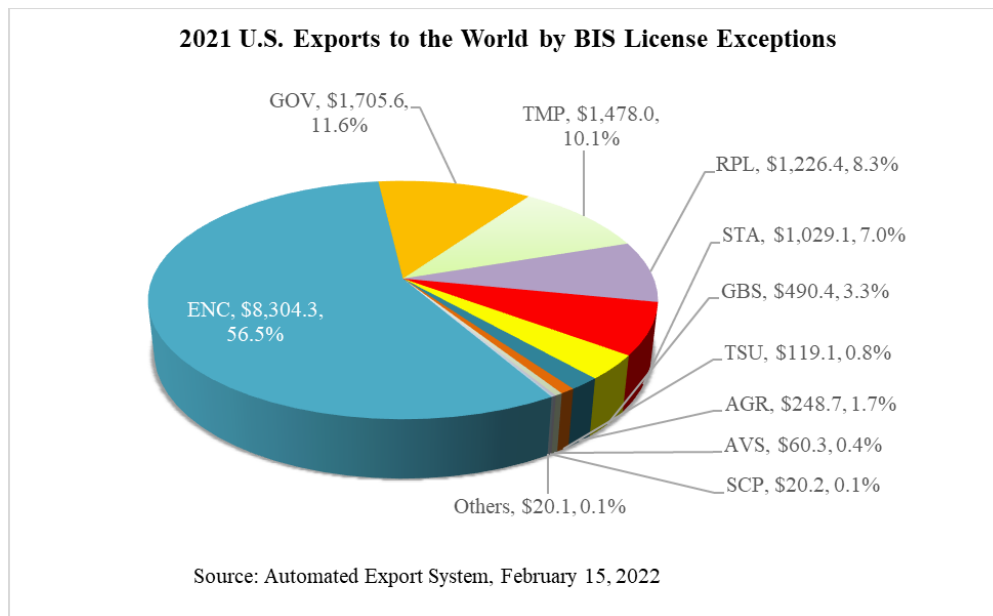
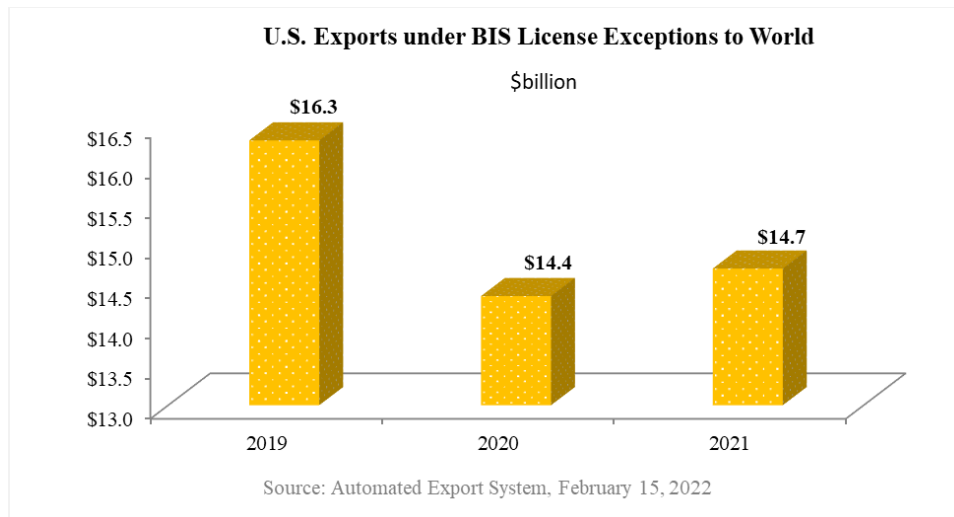

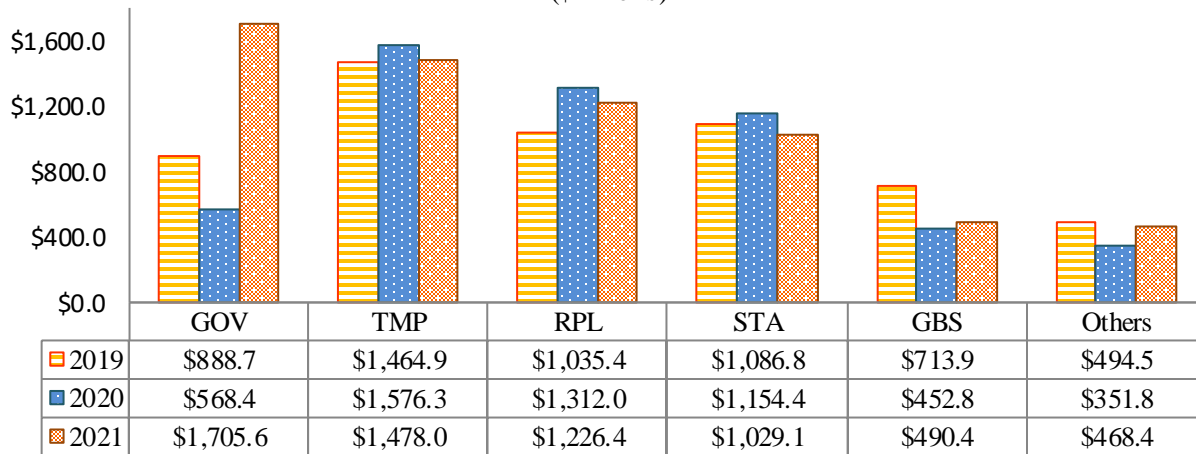

III. BIS License Determination

In 2021, BIS reviewed **40,843** license applications with a total valued of **\$1.4 trillion**. Of these, **942** for Deemed Exports, **39,901** for exports and re-exports for tangible items, software and technology, an increase of 5.0% (1,885 more) from 38,016 in 2020.

- Approved licenses totaled 34,369, an increase of 4.8% (1,560 more). The approval rate was 86.1%.
- Denied licenses applications totaled 826, an increase of 99.0% (411 more). The denied rate was 2.1%; and
- Return without action (RWA) totaled 4,706, a decrease of 1.8% (86 less). The RWA rate was 11.8%.

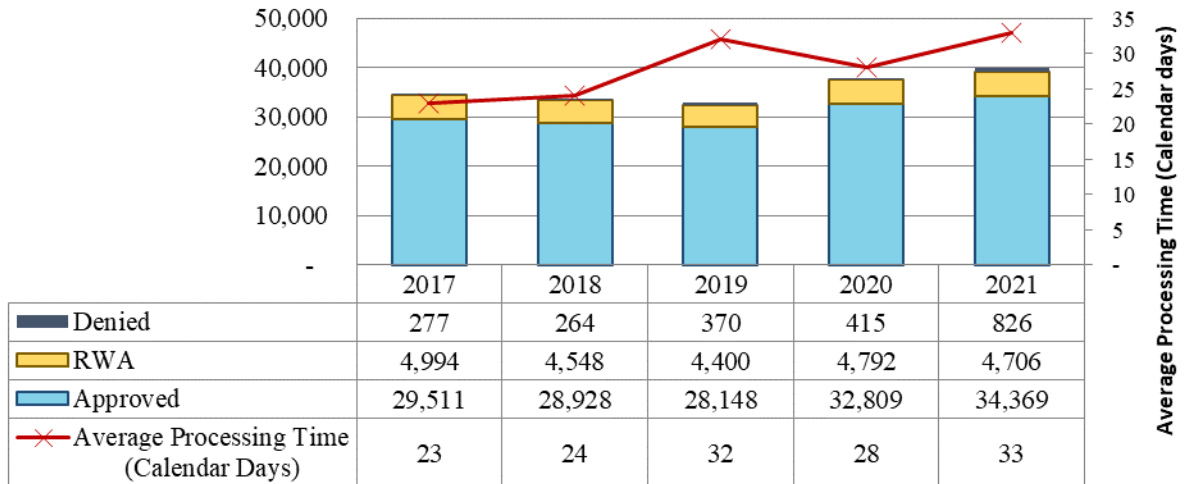

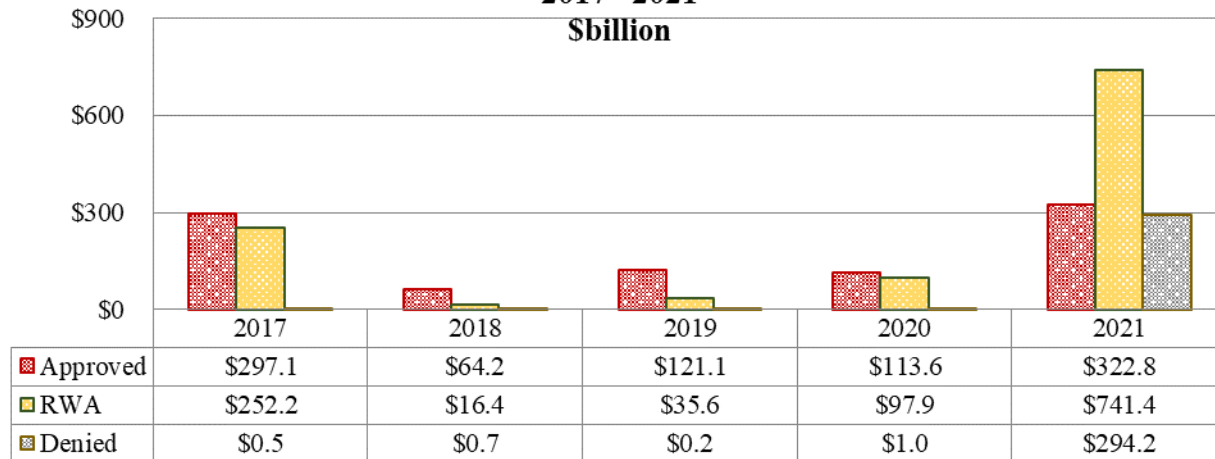
