

Summary

In 2021, U.S. exports to Panama totaled \$8.3 billion, a 46.2% (\$2.6 billion) increase from 2020. U.S. imports from Panama totaled \$756.3 million, a 6.7% (\$47.5 million) increase from 2020; and the trade surplus was \$7.5 billion, a 51.8% (\$2.6 billion) increase. The U.S. has kept a trade surplus with Panama for every year since 2016.

In 2021, 0.5% of total U.S. exports to the World were exported to Panama while 0.03% of total U.S. imports were imported from Panama.

In 2021, U.S. exports of oils, minerals, lime, and cement to Panama increased from \$2.8 billion in 2020 to \$3.9 billion. Panama was the destination of 1.6% of all U.S. exports to the World of oils, minerals, lime, and cement.

In 2021, U.S. exports to Panama shipped under a BIS license exception authorization totaled \$10.0 million, increasing from \$6.1 million in 2020. The usage of the license exception authorization for Encryption Commodities & Software was \$8.8 million, an increase from \$3.9 million in 2020.

In 2021, BIS reviewed 67 export/re-export applications for tangible items, software and technology valued at \$48.3 million for Panama. License applications for Panama counted 0.2% of the World total by license count. BIS approved 67 (100% of applications) for \$48.3 million. There were no denied license applications in 2021.

In 2021, BIS did not receive any applications from Panamanian nationals for Deemed Exports. In the last five years, BIS did not receive any applications from Panamanian nationals for Deemed Exports neither.


In 2021, the top approved ECCNs were **0A501** for Firearms (except 0A502 shotguns) and related commodities with 29 approvals, **0A502** for Shotguns; shotguns "parts" and "components" with 12 approvals; and **3A981** for Polygraphs (except biomedical recorders) with 6 approvals.

In 2021, BIS Average Processing Time was 33 calendar days.



I. Total U.S. Trade in goods with Panama

In 2021, U.S. exports to Panama totaled \$8.3 billion, a 46.2% (\$2.6 billion) increase from 2020. U.S. imports from Panama totaled \$756.3 million, a 6.7% (\$47.5 million) increase from 2020; and the trade surplus was \$7.5 billion, a 51.8% (\$2.6 billion) increase. In 2021, the level of both U.S. exports to Panama and U.S. imports from Panama exceeded the prior five-year average level by value not adjusted for inflation. In 2021, the U.S. trade surplus with Panama was also higher than the prior five-year average level by value not adjusted for inflation.

In 2021, of the \$8.3 billion in U.S. exports to Panama, the top commodity sectors were Oils, Minerals, Lime, and Cement (47.3% of total U.S. exports), Transportation Equipment (12.5%) and Agriculture products (12.1%).

In 2021, of the \$756.3 million in U.S. imports from Panama, the top commodity sectors were Special Classification items (56.9%), Agriculture Products (26.1%), and Stone, Glass, Metals, and Pearls (7.3%).



In 2021, of the \$8.3 billion in U.S. exports to Panama:


- 0.2% were subject to a BIS license requirement:

 - 0.1% were exported under a BIS license exception; Worldwide, 0.8% were exported under a BIS license exception.
- 7.0% were exported under No License Required (NLR) with an ECCN and NLR for .y 600-series item:
 - 7.0% were exported under NLR with an ECCN reported; Worldwide, 10.0% were exported under NLR with an ECCN reported.
 - 0.00003% were exported under NLR for .y 600-series items; Worldwide, 0.02% were exported under NLR for .y 600-series items.
 - 0.00004% were exported under NLR for YFA .y subparagraph Firearms items; Worldwide, 0.001% were exported under NLR for .y 600-series items.






U.S. Exports to Panama subject to U.S. Government Export Control





In 2021, top U.S. exports to Panama under BIS license exceptions were Encryption Commodities, Software and Technology (ENC) with a value of \$8.8 million (88.0% of all license exceptions); and Governments, International Organizations (GOV) with a value of \$0.7 million (6.7%).







III. BIS Licensing for Panama

In 2021, BIS reviewed 67 export/re-export applications valued at \$48.3 million for Panama, out of a total of 39,901 applications worldwide for tangible items, software, and technology, valued at \$1.4 trillion. License applications for Panama counted 0.2% of the World total by license count.

- BIS approved 67 (100% of the total applications) for \$48.3 million, compared to 34,369 (86.1%) approved applications for all destinations valued at \$322.8 billion.
