

Summary

In 2021, the U.S. trade with Venezuela slightly increased after experiencing a precipitous decline in 2019; and the U.S. maintained its trade surplus. In 2021, U.S. exports to Venezuela totaled \$1.7 billion, a 46.2% (\$522.4 million) increase; U.S. imports from Venezuela totaled \$302.2 million, an 80.5% (\$134.8 million) increase; and the trade surplus was \$1.4 billion.

In 2021, U.S. exports to Venezuela were concentrated in Agricultural Products and Machinery and Mechanical Appliances. In 2021, Agricultural Products constituted 37.8% of the total U.S. exports and Machinery and Mechanical Appliances were 27.6% of the total. U.S. exports of Oils, Minerals, Lime, and Cement to Venezuela increased nearly threefold from 2020-21.

In 2021, U.S. exports to Venezuela shipped under a BIS license exception authorization totaled \$3.4 million, a decrease of \$1.9 million from 2020. In 2021, the use of the license exception Encryption Commodities and Software (ENC) decreased to \$3.2 million from \$5.1 million in 2020.

In 2021, U.S. exports to Venezuela shipped under BIS licenses, the top ECCN by value was 1B998 for Continuous Mixers and "Specially Designed" "Parts" and "Components."


In 2021, BIS reviewed 30 export/re-export license applications (not including deemed export applications) for tangible items, software and technology valued at \$17.4 million for Venezuela. In 2021, BIS approved 17 (56.7% of the total applications) for \$1.2 million, RWA totaled 12 for \$16.0 million, and there was 1 denied application worth \$0.2 million.

In 2021, the top approved ECCNs, including ECCNs for deemed exports, were **2B350** for Chemical Manufacturing Facilities and Equipment with 9 approvals and **3A231** for Neutron Generator Systems with 2 approvals. Compared to 2020, 2B350 remained the top approved ECCN. The only denied application was for 1A613, Armored and Protective Equipment.

In 2021, the average processing time for Venezuela was 20 days.



In 2021, the U.S. trade with Venezuela remained at low levels after the precipitous decline in 2019 and the trade surplus with Venezuela grew by \$387.6 million. In 2021, U.S. exports to Venezuela totaled \$1.7 billion, a 46.2% (\$522.4 million) increase. U.S. imports from Venezuela totaled \$302.2 million, an 80.5% (\$134.8 million) increase, and the trade surplus was \$1.4 billion.



In 2021, both the level of U.S. exports to, and U.S. imports from Venezuela is below the prior five-year average level by value not adjusted for inflation. In 2021, the U.S. trade balance with Venezuela remained positive after the trade deficit became a trade surplus in 2020.

In 2021, of the \$1.7 billion in U.S. exports to Venezuela, the top commodity sectors were Agricultural Products (37.8%), Machinery and Mechanical Appliances (27.6%), and Chemicals, Plastics, Rubber, and Leather Goods (11.7%).

In 2021, of the \$302.2 million in U.S. imports from Venezuela, the top commodity sectors were Agricultural Products (57.6%), Chemicals, Plastics, Rubber, and Leather Goods (14.6%), and Machinery and Mechanical Appliances (12.9%).

The Shares of U.S. – Venezuela Trade in U.S. Global Trade

In 2021, <u>0.1%</u> of total <u>U.S. exports</u> were shipped to Venezuela while <u>0.01%</u> of total <u>U.S. Imports</u> were delivered from Venezuela.

U.S. Trade with Venezuela in Oils, Minerals, Lime, and Cement

In 2021, the U.S. increased exports of Oils, Minerals, Lime, and Cement to Venezuela while further decreasing its imports of Oils, Minerals, Lime, and Cement from Venezuela. In 2020, U.S. exports of Oils, Minerals, Lime, and Cement declined from \$325.5 million in 2019 to \$27.5 million, a decline of 91.6%. However, in 2021, U.S. exports of Oils, Minerals, Lime, and Cement grew to \$78.2 million, a nearly threefold increase. U.S. imports of Oils, Minerals, Lime, and Cement from Venezuela further declined from \$15.1 million in 2020 to just \$1.6 million in 2021.

U.S. Trade with Venezuela in Chemicals, Plastics, Rubber, and Leather Goods Increases

In 2021, U.S. exports of Chemicals, Plastics, Rubber, and Leather goods grew from \$117.7 million in 2020 to \$193.1 million, a 64.1% (\$75.4 million) increase. Similarly, U.S. imports of Chemicals, Plastics, Rubber, and Leather goods from Venezuela totaled \$44.0 million, almost 22 times of \$2.0 million in 2020.


II. U.S. Exports to Venezuela subject to U.S. Government Export Control

In 2021, of the \$1.7 billion in U.S. exports to Venezuela:

- There were no U.S. exports to Venezuela under ITAR
- \circ 0.2% were subject to a BIS license requirement
 - 0.01% were exported under a BIS license; Worldwide, 0.4% were exported under a BIS license.
 - 0.2% were exported under a BIS license exception; Worldwide, 0.8% were exported under a BIS license exception.
- $\circ~0.4\%$ were exported under No License Required with an ECCN; Worldwide, 10.0% were exported under NLR with an ECCN reported
 - There were no exports to Venezuela under NLR for 600-series. y subparagraph items or NLR for 0A501. y subparagraph Firearms items.








In 2021, U.S. exports to Venezuela shipped under a BIS license exception totaled \$3.4 million, a 35.9% (\$1.9 million) decrease from 2020.



The top license exception Encryption Commodities and Software totaled \$3.2 million (93.1% of all license exceptions).






U.S. Exports to Venezuela Subject to U.S. Government Export Control




III. BIS Licensing to Venezuela

In 2021, BIS reviewed 30 export/re-export applications (not including deemed export applications) valued at \$17.4 million for Venezuela, out of a total of 39,901 applications worldwide for tangible items, software and technology valued at \$1.4 trillion.

– Approved applications for Venezuela totaled 17 (56.7% of the total applications) valued at \$1.2 million, compared to 34,369 (86.1%) approved for all destinations valued at \$322.8 billion.
