Dear Mr. Chairman:

I hereby report to the Congress the export licensing actions taken by the Department of Commerce's Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) relating to exports of agricultural commodities to Cuba from July through September 2011. Section 906(b) of the Trade Sanctions Reform and Export Enhancement Act of 2000 (TSRA) (Title IX of Pub. L. 106-387), as amended, requires this report.

During the reporting period, BIS processed 21 notifications under License Exception Agricultural Commodities (AGR) for exports to Cuba. Of these, we approved 19 notifications in an average of 9 days. In addition, we returned 1 notification without action 2 days after receipt due to errors made in the notification by the submitter. We also converted 1 notification into an export license application and then returned it without action 6 days after receipt due to errors.

Additionally, BIS processed 6 standard export license applications for exports of AGR-eligible commodities to Cuba during the reporting period. BIS approved 2 of the applications in an average of 30 days. The remaining 4 applications were returned without action in an average of 6 days to allow the applicants to resubmit the applications as AGR notifications or because the applications contained errors. BIS did not deny any applications for exports of AGR-eligible commodities to Cuba during the reporting period. Enclosed is a chart illustrating these licensing actions.
