#### **Effective Date of ECR Regulations**

- AES Changes will be in early October 2013
- Allowing for filing dates in AES in early October 2013 for exports of "600 series" items with an export shipment date of October 15, 2013 or later





#### Addition of "600 Series" ECCNs

- October 2013 ECCNs 9A610, 9A619, 9B610, 9B619, 9C610, 9C619, 9D610, 9D619, 9E610 and 9E619 will be added to AES ECCN reference table
- New "600 series" ECCNs will be added as additional items from USML categories transition to the CCL





#### **New AES License Type – C60 (DY6)**

- Required for .y paragraph 600-series items only
- Identifies less significant military items



# License Exception Strategic Trade Authorization (STA)

- June 16, 2011 Creation of BIS License Exception STA (EAR §740.20)
- October 15, 2013 Use of STA for "600 Series"
  - AES edits ensure that only specific ECCNs and specific countries are eligible for STA
  - Government end-uses and transactions otherwise authorized by the U.S. Government

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#### **Overview of EAR §758.1 Changes**

- AES Filing is Required:
  - For all exports of "600 series" items enumerated in paragraphs .a through .x of a "600 series" ECCN regardless of value or destination, including exports to Canada
  - For all exports under License Exception Strategic
    Trade Authorization (STA)

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#### **AES Editing on "600 Series" ECCNs**

- Only certain license types will be eligible for "600 Series" ECCNs
  - > Fatal Errors if reported incorrectly
- Refer to AES-ECR email broadcast
- Review Appendix F of the AES Trade Interface Requirements (AESTIR) for specific reporting instructions

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#### **AES Editing on "600 Series" ECCNs**

- C30, C31, C40, C41, C42, C59
  - > All 10 ECCNs permitted
- C32
  - > All 10 ECCNs permitted to Canada only
- C35
  - > 9A610, 9A619, 9B610, 9B619, 9C610, 9C619
- C44
  - > 9D610, 9D619, 9E610, 9E619

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# Reporting Items under "600 Series" .Y Paragraph ECCNs

- AES Creating New License Type DY6 (C60)
  - Required for .y paragraph "600 series" items only
  - Low value and Canadian exemptions apply to DY6 (C60)
  - ECCNs are allowed but not required
  - License Number "DY6" is required

#### **Overview of EAR §758.2 Changes**

- Grounds for Denial for AES Post-Departure Filing include:
  - Exports made under BIS License Exception Strategic Trade Authorization (STA); under authorization Validated End User (VEU); or are of "600 series" items



#### **Overview of EAR §758.6 Changes**

- Annotation on Invoices, BOLs, AWBs or other export control documentation:
  - > The ECCN of a "600 Series" ECCN item





#### **EAR Items Licensed under ITAR**

- State Department may license an item subject to EAR on an ITAR approval
  - > ITAR section 120.5(b)
- AES filer must report the ECCN or EAR99 in the ECCN field
  - Even for license type S05 (DSP-5)

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#### **Exclusions**

[FTR 30.2(d)]

#### **New Exclusion**

- 1. AES filing is not required for: Licensed goods where the country of ultimate destination is the United States
- 2. Goods destined to international waters where the person(s) or entity assuming control of the item(s) is a U.S. citizen or permanent resident alien of the United States [30.2(d)(5)]

The exclusion legend is required to be reported on commercial loading documents



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#### **International Waters**

[FTR 30.6]

#### **Definition**

 Waters located outside the U.S. territorial sea, which extends 12 nautical miles measured from the baselines of the United States, and outside the territory of any foreign country....

#### Licensable Shipments

 The person designated on the export license must be reported as the ultimate consignee

#### License Exceptions/Non-licensable Shipments

 Report the nationality of the person(s) or entity assuming control of the item(s) subject to the EAR [30.6(a)(5)(i)]



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#### **Port of Export**

[FTR 30.6(a)(9)]

# The port of export for shipments by overland transportation is where the goods cross the border





Note: This includes transshipments through Canada or Mexico

[FTR 30.6]

#### **License Value**

#### **Ultimate Consignee Type**

- Direct Consumer
- Government Entity
- Reseller
- Other/Unknown



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#### **Postdeparture Filing**

[FTR 30.5]

#### Current

- Postdeparture filing time frame from 10 calendar days to 5 calendar days
- The moratorium on new applications will continue

#### **Future**

 The Census Bureau and Customs and Border Protection will implement an alternate pilot program



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# Advanced Export Information (AEI) Pilot

- All interested USPPIs will have to apply
- Predeparture data elements to be reported
  - 1. USPPI information
- 7. Port of export
- 2. Ultimate Consignee
- 8. Date of export
- 3. Filer ID number
- 9. SCAC/IATA code (Carrier code)
- 4. Shipment Reference Number
- 10. Conveyance Name
- 5. Schedule B/HTS number
- 11. License code (If needed)
- 6. Product description
- 12. Export Control Classification Number (ECCN) (If needed)
- Remainder items filed within 5 calendar days

#### **Automated Export Processing Goals**

November 2012 – CBP initiated an Agile development effort to move the legacy Automated Export System (AES) to an ACE Re-engineered system platform with the following goals:

- Establish a single automated processing platform for all export commodity, manifest, licensing (not to overlap with USXPORTS functionality), and other government agencies' processing needs for all modes of transportation (air, rail, sea and truck).
- Work with the Census Bureau and the Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) to support the President's National Export Initiative and Export Control Reform (ECR) Initiative
- Work with the Trade Support Network (TSN) through the Automated Export Task Group (MMM, ITDS, and Export Committees) and other trade groups to determine export trade user requirements.
- Work with the Participating Government Agencies (PGAs) through the ITDS board and other partnerships to identify PGA export user requirements for licenses, permits and data collections.

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#### **AES Re-Engineering**

These goals will be accomplished through the following development:

- Replacing the legacy AES mainframe system with a modern IT platform conforming to the CBP Enterprise Technical Architecture that will drive down operating and future development cost.
- Replacing manual or paper based processing in exports for licensing, manifest and notifications with electronic processing to better facilitate movement of compliant shipments and identification of high risk shipments.
- Implementing a single window in the re-engineered AES that allows the CBP user to view all commodity, enforcement, licensing and findings data from a single application.
- Leveraging recent ACE functionality development on imports to provide a means in exports for additional services for CBP, PGAs and the trade community.



#### **AES Enhancements**

#### Bureau of the Census:

The reengineered AES will include the following enhancements for Census Bureau regulatory changes:

- Post-departure filing times changed from ten (10) to five (5) calendar days from the date of exportation
- Added Ultimate Consignee Type
- Added License Value
- Foreign Trade Zone Identifier increased from five to seven alpha-numeric characters

Advanced Export Information (AEI) pilot for filing of 11 mandatory data elements pre-departure and remaining data elements filed five days post departure (this is a revised Option 3 process to provide certain trade members the ability to file the commodity data with a limited set of data).



#### Sorter Protection AES Enhancements - continued

#### Bureau of Industry and Security:

CBP is working with BIS to include:

- Development of license decrementation capability within the reengineered AES platform.
- Provide a placeholder for the potential expansion of the Export Control Classification Number (ECCN) in support of possible future regulatory changes.
- Development of better validations and edits on license data to enhance processing of filings and notifications.



#### U.S. Customs and AES Enhancements - continued

#### Participating Government Agencies:

 The AES development team is also working to identify additional PGAs license types, data elements, Document Imaging System submissions and other functionality to include as possible pilots in the re-engineered system.

#### **Export Manifest:**

 The AES development team is also working closely with the Air and Rail groups to identify electronic export manifest filing functionality.



# W.S.Customs and AES Re-Engineering — Current Status

AES Re-Engineering is being built in a series of Increments. Four (4) Increments make up the AES Re-**Engineering Project:** 

- Increment 1 Trade Electronic Data Interchange (EDI) – Completed January 2013
- Increment 2 CBP User Interface, Enforcement **Completed April 2013**
- Increment 3 User Interface, Inbound and Outbound data feeds – July 2013
- Increment 4 Findings and outstanding system enhancements - September 2013
