Dear Mr. Chairman:

I hereby report to the Congress the export licensing actions taken by the Department of Commerce's Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) relating to exports of agricultural commodities to Cuba from October through December 2012. Section 906(b) of the Trade Sanctions Reform and Export Enhancement Act of 2000 (TSRA) (Title IX of Pub. L. 106-387), as amended, requires this report.

During the reporting period, BIS processed 26 notifications under License Exception Agricultural Commodities (AGR) for exports to Cuba. Of these, we approved 25 notifications in an average of five days. In addition, we returned one notification without action in two days due to errors made by the submitter in the notification.

Additionally, BIS processed four standard export license applications for exports of AGR-eligible commodities to Cuba during the reporting period. BIS returned these four applications without action in an average of five days to allow the applicants to resubmit the applications as AGR notifications. BIS did not approve or deny any applications for exports of AGR-eligible commodities to Cuba during the reporting period. Enclosed is a chart illustrating these licensing actions.

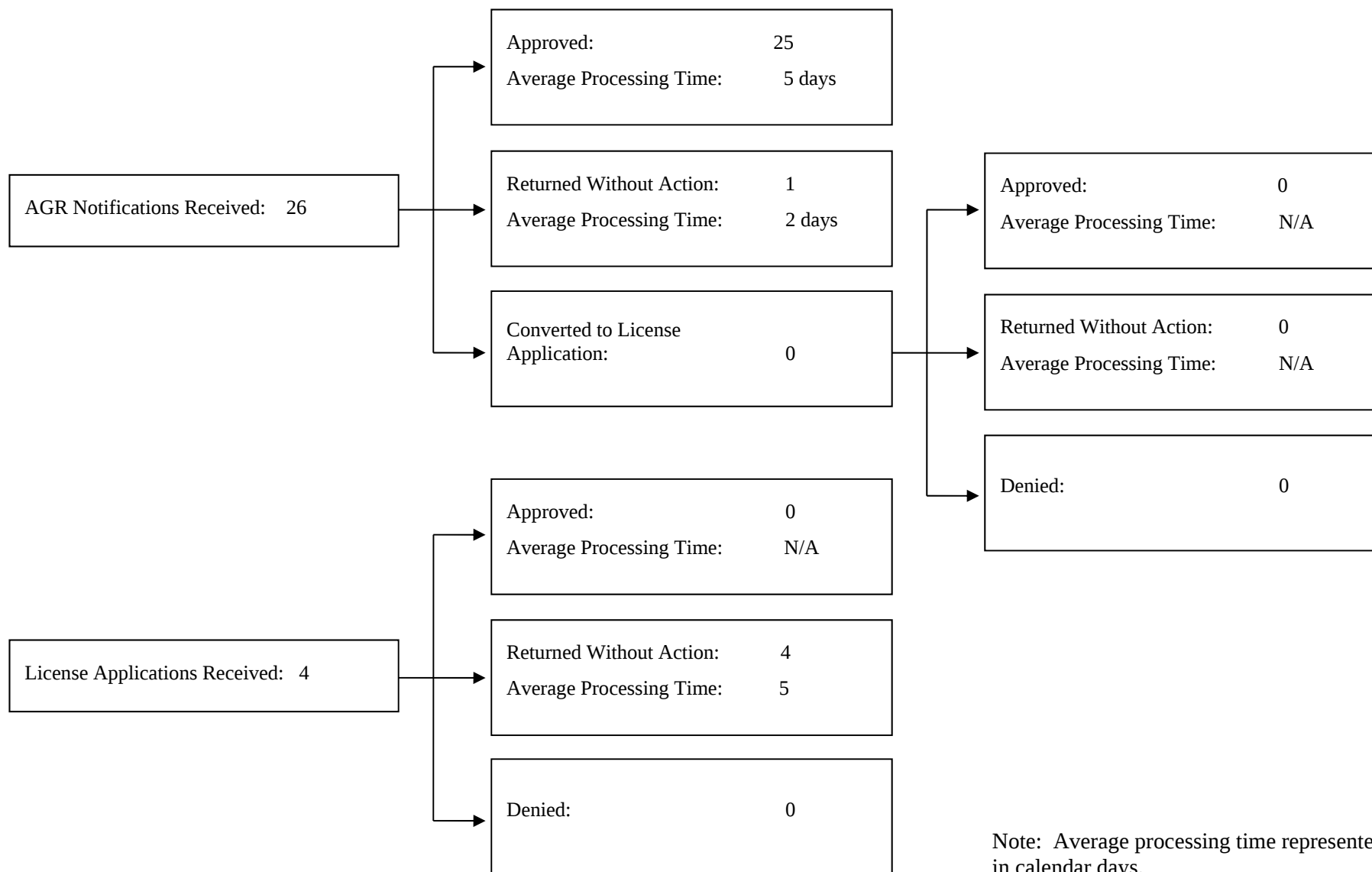
