

U.S. Trade with Canada

Summary

In 2020, U.S. exports to Canada totaled \$255.1 billion, a 12.8% (\$37.5 billion) decrease from 2019; U.S. imports from Canada totaled \$270.4 billion, a 15.4% (\$49.0 billion) decrease; and the trade deficit was \$15.2 billion, a 43.2% (\$11.6 billion) decrease.

In 2020, of the \$255.1 billion in U.S. exports to Canada, the top commodity sectors were Machinery and Mechanical Appliances (23.8%), Transportation Equipment (17.8%), and Chemicals, Plastics, and Leather products (15.3%). In 2020, of the \$270.4 billion in U.S. imports from Canada, the top commodity sectors were Minerals (22.3%), Transportation Equipment (17.4%), and Chemicals, Plastics, and Leather products (11.3%).

Canada maintains a significant share of the U.S.-World Trade. In 2020, <u>17.8%</u> of total <u>U.S. exports</u> were shipped to Canada while <u>11.6%</u> of total <u>U.S. Imports</u> were delivered from Canada.

In 2020, U.S. exported \$7.5 billion worth of furniture, bedding, lamps, toys, games, sport equipment, paint and other miscellaneous manufactured items to Canada, representing 46.9% of the total U.S. exports to the World of those commodities. U.S exports of \$8.7 billion worth of Word Products, represented 26.6% of the total U.S. exports to the World of those commodities. Additionally, U.S. exported \$15.0 billion worth of Base Metals, representing 26.0% of the total U.S. exports of those commodities.

In 2020, U.S. imported \$60.3 billion worth of Minerals from Canada, representing 47.1% of the total U.S. imports of those commodities. U.S. imports of \$18.4 billion worth of Wood Products, representing 42.2% of total U.S. imports of those commodities. Additionally, U.S. imports of \$21.2 billion worth of Base Metals, represented 19.4% of the total U.S. imports of those commodities.

In 2020, BIS reviewed 1,340 export/re-export license applications (not including deemed export applications) for tangible items, software and technology valued at \$6.5 billion for Canada. License applications for Canada counted 3.5% of the World total by license count.

BIS approved 1,169 (87.2% of the total applications) for \$6.4 billion, RWA totaled 171 for \$128.1 million, and there were no denials.

In 2020, BIS approved 11 out of 12 applications (91.7%) from Canadian nationals for deemed exports. There was 1 RWA and no denials.

In 2020, the top four approved ECCNs are all new ECCNs created by the USML to the CCL regulatory change on firearms, including ECCNs for deemed exports, were 0A501 for Firearms (except 0A502 shotguns) and related Commodities with 506 approvals; 0A505 for Ammunition with 254 approvals; and 0A504 for Optical Sighting Devices for Firearms (including shotguns controlled by 0A502) with 221 approvals. Four of the 500-series firearms ECCNs created in 2020 are in the top ten approved ECCNs to Canada.

In 2020, the average processing time for Canada is 18 days.



U.S. Trade with Canada

I. Total U.S. Trade in goods with Canada

In 2020, U.S. exports to Canada totaled \$255.1 billion, a 12.8% (\$37.5 billion) decrease from 2019; U.S. imports from Canada totaled \$270.4 billion, a 15.4% (\$49.0 billion) decrease; and the trade deficit was \$15.2 billion, a 43.2% (\$11.6 billion) decrease.



In 2020, the level of U.S. exports to, and U.S. imports from Canada did not exceed the prior five-year average level by value not adjusted for inflation. The U.S. trade deficit with Canada is also lower than the prior five-year average level by value not adjusted for inflation.


In 2020, of the \$255.1 billion in U.S. exports to Canada:

 - > 0.05% were exported under a BIS license; Worldwide, 0.5% were exported under a BIS license.
 - > 0.1% were exported under a BIS license exception; Worldwide, 1.0% were exported under a BIS license exception.
- 0.3% were exported under No License Required with an ECCN and NLR for 600-series.y subparagraph items:
 - ➤ 0.3% were exported under No License Required with an ECCN; Worldwide, 10.7% were exported under NLR with an ECCN reported.
 - ➤ 0.01% were exported under NLR for 600-series .y subparagraph items; Worldwide, 0.02% were exported under NLR for 600-series .y subparagraph items.
 - ➤ 0.0004% were exported under NLR for 0A501.y subparagraph Firearm items; Worldwide, 0.001% were exported under NLR for 0A501.y subparagraph Firearm items.






U.S. Exports to Canada

In 2020, U.S. exports to Canada shipped under a BIS license exception totaled \$238.4 million, a \$17.5 million (7.9%) increase from 2019.





In 2020, the top license exception, Servicing and Replacement of Parts and Equipment (RPL), totaled \$137.9 million (57.8% of all license exceptions), followed by Encryption Commodities, Software and Technology (ENC) with \$52.8 million (22.1%), and Technology and Software—Unrestricted (TSU) with \$25.5 million (10.7%).




BIS License Determination Trends for Canada

III. BIS Licensing to Canada

In 2020, BIS reviewed 1,340 export/re-export applications (not including deemed export applications) valued at \$6.5 billion for Canada, out of a total of 38,203 applications worldwide for tangible items, software and technology valued at \$219.4 billion. License applications for Canada counted 3.5% of the World total by license count.

- Approved applications for Canada totaled 1,169 (87.2% of the total applications) for \$6.4 billion, compared to 32,996 (86.4%) approved applications for all destinations valued at \$120.5 billion.



In 2020, BIS reviewed twelve deemed export applications from Canadian nationals, out of a total of 1,216 applications worldwide.

- Approved deemed exports applications from Canadian nationals 11 (91.7% of the total applications), compared to 1,068 (87.7%) approved for all destinations.


In the last five years, there were no denials for Deemed Export applications for Canadian nationals.

The significant increase in approved value is due to the creation of ECCN 0A501, 0A505, 0A504 and 0A502 under the USML to the CCL regulatory change on firearms effective on March 9, 2020.
