  - Licensing policy

  - \* Validated End Users
  - \* Entity List



# Interagency Collaboration Essential for Export Control System

- \* License applications
  - \* 23,825 reviewed in 2012
  - \* Operating Committee
    - \* 244 reviewed in 2012
  - \* Advisory Committee on Export Policy
    - \* 35 reviewed in 2012
- \* Commodity jurisdiction determinations
- \* Bilateral relationships



## Impact of Completed ECR Reforms Encryption

- \* Encryption Export Controls: Revision of License Exception ENC and Mass Market Eligibility, Submission Procedures, Reporting Requirements, License Application Requirements, and Addition of Note 4 to Category 5, Part 2 (June 25, 2010; 75 Federal Register 36481)
- Replaced 30 day technical review period and sales reports for most items eligible for License Exception ENC and mass market products with registration and self-classification report
- Excluded certain items incorporating or using "cryptography" from control under Category 5, Part



#### IMPACT OF COMPLETED ECR REFORMS ENCRYPTION

- \* 4,116 companies have registered
- \* Classification requests reduced by about 30%
  - \* 3,200 in FY 2010
  - \* 2,100 in FY 2011
  - \* 2,200 in FY 2012
  - \* 1,100 in first half of FY13



### Impact of Completed ECR Reforms Strategic Trade Authorization

- \* Export Control Reform Initiative: Strategic Trade Authorization License Exception (June 16, 2011; 76 Federal Register 35276)
- Authorizes export, reexport and transfer (in-country) of specified items that pose relatively low risk in specified destinations without individual license
- \* Items can subsequently be reexported without a license to another STA country
- \* Authorization required for other reexports



#### Impact of Completed ECR Reforms – Strategic Trade Authorization

- \* Strategic Trade Authorization
  - \* July 2011 through April 2013
  - \* 117 companies have exported under STA
  - \* \$165.7 million worth of exports under STA
  - \* 1,743 shipments under STA
    - \* 37% (645) exports worth less than \$2,500



# Impact of Completed ECR Reforms – Strategic Trade Authorization

- \* Top ECCNs Exported to 36 STA (c)(1) countries
  - \* 6A003
    - \* 492 shipments by 19 exporters worth \$23,738,737
  - \* 0A018
    - \* 24 shipments by 5 exporters worth \$13,289,302
  - \* 9A004
    - \* 201 shipments by 7 exporters worth \$9,087,401
  - \* oA987
    - \* 623 shipments by 21 exporters worth \$2,237,957



# Impact of Completed ECR Reforms – Strategic Trade Authorization

- \* Compliance
  - \* 98 of 117 STA users audited to date
    - \* 87% compliance rate
  - \* Errors (13)
    - \* Failure to notify consignee of ECCN or obtain required consignee statement prior to shipment (4)
    - \* Failed to provide consignee statement prior to shipment (5)
    - \* Ineligible Export Control Classification Number (2)
    - \* Failure to answer BIS questions for support documents (2)



#### **Export Control Reform Executive Order**

- \* The new Executive Order of March 8, 2013 makes the following changes:
  - \* 1. Consolidation of All Brokering Responsibilities with the Department of State
  - \* 2. Elimination of Possible "Double Licensing" Requirements
  - \* 3. Congressional Notification Process
  - \* 4. Other Administrative Updates
  - \* 5. Changes to the U.S. Munitions List




#### **CONCLUSION**


- \* Interagency collaboration will continue to be critical to ECR
