

The Third Rule of USML to CCL Regulatory Change Missiles and Explosives July 1, 2014 to December 31, 2021

Since the third rule of the USML to the CCL regulatory change became effective on July 1, 2014, to December 31, 2021, BIS has processed a total of 10,615 license applications for a value of \$10.9 billion for the twenty 600-Series items created by this rule. The average number of BIS license applications is 118 per month. BIS has approved a total of 9,424 licenses for a value of \$10.1 billion and the approval rate is 88.8%.




From July 1, 2014, to December 31, 2021, U.S. exports of items in the third rule of the USML to the CCL regulatory change – Missiles and Explosives items (0y604, 0y614, 1y608 and 1y613) under BIS jurisdiction totaled 41,769 shipments for \$2.5 billion.

Of \$2.5 billion in U.S. exports of 600-series items in the third rule of the USML to the CCL regulatory change under BIS jurisdiction from July 1, 2014, to December 31, 2021, licensed exports totaled \$1.5 billion (58.4% of the total); Strategic Trade Authorization (STA) totaled \$369.1 million (14.6%); and Governments and international organizations (GOV) totaled \$309.0 million (12.2%).
