


# Statistical Analysis of U.S. Trade with Malaysia

### I. Total U.S. Trade with Malaysia

The U.S. trade deficit with Malaysia was \$24.8 billion, a 14.4% (\$3,126.9 million) increase from 2015:

- Exports to Malaysia were \$11.9 billion, a 3.3% (\$410.3 million) decrease from 2015;
- Imports from Malaysia were \$36.7 billion, an 8.0% (\$2,716.6 million) increase from 2015.


Of the \$36.7 billion imports from Malaysia in 2016, the top commodities were:

- Machinery (77.1%), Chemicals, plastics, leather products (6.1%)
- Of the \$11.9 billion exports to Malaysia in 2016, the top commodities were:
  - Machinery (60.1%), Chemicals, plastics, leather products (9.1%)

The U.S. Advanced Technology Products (ATP)<sup>1</sup> trade deficit was \$ 18.1 Billion:

- ATP Exports to Malaysia valued \$7.1 billion, a 2.2% (\$161 million) decrease from 2015;
- ATP imports from Malaysia were \$25.2 billion, a 14.8% (\$3,252 million) increase from 2015.




#### **Exports to Malaysia subject to US Government Filing Requirements** II.

- 17.5% of the U.S. exports to Malaysia in 2016 were subject to a BIS license requirement: 0.2% were exported under a BIS license; Worldwide, 0.5% were exported under a BIS license. 17.3% were exported to Malaysia under a BIS license exception; Worldwide, 1.6% were exported under a BIS exception.
- 22.1% of U.S. exports to Malaysia in 2016 were subject to No License Requirement. Worldwide, 12.2% were exported under No License Required with an ECCN.


- 97.5% included Encryption Commodities and Software (ENC);
- 1.3% included Shipments to Group B Countries (GBS);













## BIS Licensing to Malaysia

#### III. Licensing to the Malaysia subject to US Government Filing Requirements

In 2016, BIS reviewed 511 export/re-export applications (not including deemed export applications) valued at \$11.0 billion for Malaysia, out of a total 33,195 applications worldwide valued at \$235.4 billion.

• Approved applications for Malaysia totaled 458 (89.6%), compared with the 28,214 (85.0%) approved applications for all destinations that totaled \$210.3 billion.
