

U.S. Trade with Saudi Arabia

Summary

In 2021, U.S. exports to Saudi Arabia totaled \$11.1 billion, a 0.3% (\$28.8 million) increase from 2020; U.S. imports from Saudi Arabia totaled \$13.5 billion, a 50.4% (\$4.5 billion) increase; and the trade deficit was \$2.4 billion, a change of 212.8% (\$4.5 billion) from a trade surplus of \$2.1 billion in 2020.

In 2021, <u>0.6%</u> of total <u>U.S. Exports</u> were shipped to Saudi Arabia while <u>0.5%</u> of total <u>U.S. Imports</u> were delivered from Saudi Arabia.

In 2021, the U.S. exported \$604.1 million in Arms & Ammunition to Saudi Arabia, a decrease of 1.7% (\$10.3 million) from \$\$614.5 million in 2020. U.S. Exports to Saudi Arabia now constitute 14.2% of total U.S. exports of those commodities worldwide.

In 2021, the U.S. imported \$11.1 billion in Oil, Minerals, Lime and Cement from Saudi Arabia, an increase of 46.8% (\$3.5 billion) from \$7.6 billion in 2020. In 2021, Saudi Arabia is the source of 5.0% of those commodities imported from the world.

In 2021, U.S. exports to Saudi Arabia shipped under a BIS license exception totaled \$72.3 million, a 60.8% (\$112.2 million) decrease from 2020. The usage of the license exception authorization for Encryption Commodities & Software was \$41.6 million, a 74.6% (\$122.1 million) decrease from \$163.7 million in 2020.

In 2021, BIS reviewed 620 export/re-export applications for tangible items, software, and technology (not including deemed export applications) valued at \$966.5 million for Saudi Arabia. BIS Approved applications for Saudi Arabia totaled 578 (93.2% of the total applications) for \$770.9 million. There were 42 RWA valued at \$195.6 million. There was no denied license application. In 2021, BIS processed license applications for Saudi Arabia counted 1.6% of the total license applications worldwide.

In 2021, there was no application from Saudi Arabia nationals for deemed export.

The top approved ECNNs (including deemed exports) for Saudi Arabia by count include: 2B350 for Chemical manufacturing facilities and equipment with 176 approvals; 9A610 for Military aircraft and related commodities with 78 approvals; and 0A606 for Ground vehicles and related commodities with 50 approvals.

In 2021, the average processing time for Saudi Arabia was 23 calendar days.



U.S. Trade with Saudi Arabia

I. Total U.S. Trade in goods with Saudi Arabia

In 2021, U.S. exports to Saudi Arabia totaled \$11.1 billion, a 0.3% (\$28.8 million) increase from 2020; U.S. imports from Saudi Arabia totaled \$13.5 billion, a 50.4% (\$4.5 billion) increase; and the trade deficit was \$2.4 billion, a change of 212.8% (\$4.5 billion) from a trade surplus of \$2.1 billion in 2020.



In 2021, the level of U.S. exports to Saudi Arabia and U.S. imports from Saudi Arabia was lower than the prior five-year average level by value not adjusted for inflation. The U.S. trade deficit with Saudi Arabia was higher than the prior five-year average level by value not adjusted for inflation.

U.S. Trade with Saudi Arabia

In 2021, of the \$11.1 billion in U.S. exports to Saudi Arabia, the top commodity sectors were Transportation Equipment (29.2%), Machinery & Mechanical Appliances (18.4%), and Chemicals, Plastics, Rubber, Leather Products (16.2%).

In 2021, of the \$13.5 billion in U.S. imports from Saudi Arabia, the top commodity sectors were Oils, Minerals, Lime, Cement (82.2%), Chemicals, Plastics, Rubber, Leather Products (10.1%), and Base Metals, Iron, Steel, Tools (3.3%).

The Share of U.S. – Saudi Arabia Trade in U.S. Global Trade

In 2021, <u>0.6%</u> of total <u>U.S. Exports</u> were shipped to Saudi Arabia while <u>0.5%</u> of total <u>U.S. Imports</u> were delivered from Saudi Arabia.

U.S. Exports of Arms & Ammunition to Saudi Arabia

In 2021, the U.S. exported \$604.1 million in Arms & Ammunition to Saudi Arabia, a decrease of 1.7% (\$10.3 million) from \$\$614.5 million in 2020. U.S. Exports to Saudi Arabia now constitute 14.2% of total U.S. exports of those commodities worldwide.

U.S. Imports of Oil, Minerals, Lime and Cement from Saudi Arabia

In 2021, the U.S. imported \$11.1 billion in Oil, Minerals, Lime and Cement from Saudi Arabia, an increase of 46.8% (\$3.5 billion) from \$7.6 billion in 2020. In 2021, Saudi Arabia is the source of 5.0% of those commodities imported from the world.


In 2021, of the \$11.1 billion in U.S. exports to Saudi Arabia:

- 2.0% were subject to a BIS license requirement.
 - o 1.4% were exported under a BIS license. Worldwide, 0.4% were exported under a BIS license.
 - o 0.6% were exported under a BIS license exception. Worldwide, 0.8% were exported under a BIS license exception.
- 3.3% were exported under No License Required with an ECCN; Worldwide, 10.0% were exported under NLR with an ECCN reported.






U.S. Exports to Saudi Arabia subject to U.S. Government Export Control

In 2021, U.S. exports to Saudi Arabia shipped under a BIS license exception totaled \$72.3 million, a 60.8% (\$112.2 million) decrease from 2020.




In 2021, the top license exception Encryption Commodities & Software (ENC) totaled \$41.6 million (57.6% of all license exceptions), followed by Servicing & Replacement of Parts & Equipment (RPL) at \$25.4 million (35.1%), and Government & International Organizations (GOV) at \$2.0 million (2.8%).






U.S. Exports to Saudi Arabia subject to U.S. Government Export Control






III. BIS Licensing for Saudi Arabia

In 2021, BIS reviewed 620 export/re-export applications (not including deemed export applications) valued at \$966.5 million for Saudi Arabia, out of a total of 39,901 applications worldwide for tangible items, software and technology valued at \$1.4 trillion.

– Approved applications for Saudi Arabia totaled 578 (93.2% of the total applications) for \$770.9 million, compared to 34,369 (86.1%) approved for all destinations valued at \$322.8 billion.
