
The Fifth ECR Transition Rule

Military Electronics

December 30, 2014 to March 31, 2017


The license applications for items in category XI – Military Electronics of the United States Munitions List (USML) have declined 52.9% from an average of 1,294 to 610 per month through March 31, 2017. The average monthly drop of 684 license applications is the result of certain items transitioning to the Commerce Control List (CCL) under Export Control Reform (ECR).

Since the Fifth ECR Transition Rule became effective on December 30, 2014, the average number of BIS license applications for the eight 600-Series items created by this rule is 268 per month through March 31, 2017. The approval rate is 86.7%.

BIS License Applications for the Fifth ECR Transition Rule December 30, 2014 to March 31, 2017



From the effective date of December 30, 2014 to March 31, 2017, U.S. exports of items in the Fifth ECR transition Rule – Military Electronics items (3y611 and 9y620) under BIS jurisdiction totaled 20,900 shipments for \$1.3 billion.



Of the \$1.3 billion in U.S. exports of 600-series items in the Fifth ECR transition rule under BIS jurisdiction, licensed exports totaled \$493.0 million (37.5% of the total); Strategic Trade Authorization (STA) totaled \$376.9 million (28.7%) and Servicing and replacement of parts and equipment (RPL) totaled \$149.2 million (11.4%).

BIS License Exceptions:

STA: Strategic Trade Authorization

RPL: Servicing and replacement of parts and equipment

GOV: Governments, international organizations, international inspections under the Chemical

Weapons Convention, and the International Space Station

NLR: No License Required

TMP: Temporary imports, exports, reexports, and transfers (in-country)
