Dear Mr. Chairman:

I hereby report to the Congress the export licensing actions taken by the Department of Commerce's Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) relating to exports of agricultural commodities to Cuba during April through June 2009. Section 906(b) of the Trade Sanctions Reform and Export Enhancement Act of 2000 (TSRA) (Title IX of Pub.L. 106-387), as amended, requires this report.

For the reporting period, BIS processed 50 notifications under License Exception Agricultural Commodities (AGR) for Cuba. Of these, we approved 45 notifications in an average of 8 days. In addition, we returned without action 5 notifications with an average of 2 days due to errors and deficiencies.

During this period, BIS processed 11 standard export license applications for TSRA-eligible commodities. Of these, we approved 2 cases in an average of 13 days. BIS returned without action the remaining 9 applications in an average of 4 days to allow the applicants to resubmit the applications as AGR notifications or to correct errors in their original applications. BIS did not deny any applications in for TSRA-eligible commodities during the reporting period. Enclosed is a chart illustrating these licensing actions.


